CHAPTER 336.

VEHICLES (LIGHTS).

To Provide for the Carrying of Lights upon Vehicles after Sunset.

1949. Cap. 181. [31st August, 1909.]

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Vehicles Lights Law.

Interpretation. 2. In this Law—

"road" means any road opened for wheeled traffic; "vehicle" means any carriage, cart, motor car, cycle or other conveyance constructed for conveying persons or goods.

Carrying lights at night. 2 of 19/41.

3. Every person in charge of any vehicle on any road shall carry or exhibit a sufficient light between half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise:

Provided that this section shall not apply to a person leading a bicycle.

Penalty.

4. Any person acting in contravention of this Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five hundred mils.
