THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE) REGULATIONS, 1939.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Cordwood) Order, 1939, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. No person shall—

(a) sell or purchase, or

(b) offer for sale or attempt to sell or purchase, or

(c) either directly or indirectly make any arrangements for the sale or purchase of,

any cordwood of the description appearing in column (2) or (3) or (4) of the Schedule hereto in any of the towns specified in column (1) of the said Schedule at a price in excess of the price shown in column (2) or (3) or (4) against the name of each such town in the said Schedule.

3. The Commissioner of each District shall, if so required by me, appoint Inspectors to enquire into the stocks of cordwood which are in the possession or under the control of any person, or generally of all persons, residing in any of the towns specified in column (1) of the Schedule hereto.

4. Any person residing in any of the towns specified in column (1) of the Schedule hereto, when so required to do by an Inspector appointed under clause 3 of this Order, shall make a declaration of the stock of cordwood in his possession or under his control and any such Inspector may enter upon any premises for the purpose of carrying out any inspection or search reasonably required in order to obtain the necessary information concerning the amount or condition of the stock of any such cordwood.

5. Where any person who sells or exposes for sale or holds stocks of any cordwood in any of the towns specified in column (1) of the Schedule

hereto refuses, on demand being made to him by a prospective purchaser, to sell to him any such cordwood, and such refusal is in my opinion, or in the opinion of the Commissioner of the District, unreasonable, such person shall at my request, or at the request of such Commissioner, deliver such cordwood to me or to him to be sold at a price in accordance with the provisions of clause 2 of this Order, or to be disposed of in such manner as I, or the said Commissioner, may in that behalf direct.

6. Every person selling cordwood in any of the towns specified in column (1) of the Schedule hereto, shall keep on his premises a register showing the name of each purchaser of cordwood and the quantity thereof purchased by each such purchaser.

7. For the purposes of this Order, the term "cordwood" means—
(a) firewood of a size exceeding three feet in width or in length, and
(b) roots of *Shinia* of any size.

8. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of the provisions of clause 2 or 4 or 5 or 6 of this Order, or

(b) makes a false declaration under clause 4 of this Order,

shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939.
