THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE) REGULATIONS, 1939.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Australian Flour) Amendment Order, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Australian Flour) Order, 1939, (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"), and the Principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Australian Flour) Orders, 1939.
- 2. The Schedule to the Principal Order is hereby repealed and the following Schedule is substituted therefor:—

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE) REGULATIONS, 1939.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Locally-made Leather) Order, 1939, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the Gazette.
 - 2. No person shall—

(a) sell or purchase, or

(b) offer for sale or attempt to sell or purchase, or

(c) either directly or indirectly make any arrangement for the sale or purchase of,

any locally-made leather of the kind and weight specified in columns 1 and 2 respectively of the Schedule hereto, in any town or village in the Colony, at a price in excess of the price specified in column 3 or 4 of the said Schedule, as the case may be, opposite the kind of such locally-made leather.

- 3. The Commissioner of each District shall, if so required by me, appoint Inspectors to enquire into the stocks of locally-made leather which are in the possession or control of any person or generally of all persons residing in any town or village within his District.
- 4. Any person when so required to do by an Inspector appointed under clause 3 of this Order shall make a declaration of the stock of locally-made leather in his possession or under his control and any such Inspector may enter upon any premises for the purposes of carrying out any inspection or search reasonably required in order to obtain the necessary information concerning the amount or condition of the stock of any such locally-made leather.
- 5. Where any person who sells or exposes for sale or holds stocks of any locally-made leather refuses, on demand being made to him by a prospective purchaser, to sell to him any such locally-made leather and such refusal is in my opinion or in the opinion of the Commissioner of the District unreasonable, such person shall at my request, or at the request of such Commissioner, deliver such locally-made leather to me or to him to be sold at a price in accordance with the provisions of clause 2 of this Order, or to be disposed of in such manner as I or the said Commissioner may in that behalf direct.
 - 6. Any person who-
 - (a) acts in contravention of the provisions of clause 2 or 5 of this Order, or
- (b) makes a false declaration under clause 4 of this Order, shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939.
