## ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1897

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

W. D. BATTERSHILL, Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Certain Goods

(Prohibition) Order, 1939.

2. From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the Gazette the importation into the Colony of the goods set out in the Schedule hereto not being consigned from and grown, produced or manufactured in the British Empire (other than Canada and Newfoundland) is absolutely prohibited:

Provided that nothing in this Order contained shall apply to any goods proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller of Customs and Inland Revenue to have been shipped to Cyprus prior to the date of

the commencement of this Order.
