# NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Quarantine Law, 1932, or otherwise, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared that the local areas in the first column of the Schedule hereto are infected local areas and that all passengers and goods therefrom shall, as from the date hereof, be subject to the measures prescribed by the Quarantine Regulations, 1932 to 1936, with respect to the dangerous infectious diseases in the second column of the Schedule hereto.

The Notification No. 51, published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 10th March, 1939, is hereby cancelled.

#### The Foreshore Protection Law, 1934.

#### NOTICE UNDER SECTION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Foreshore Protection Law, 1934, I, Ronald Paul Lambert Browne, Commissioner of Famagusta, hereby prescribe the land described in the Schedule hereto to be foreshore for all purposes of the said Law.

# The Foreshore.

The foreshore commences at a point situated to the north, north-east of plot 47, sheet XXXIII, plan 4, (near the main road to Famagusta Harbour) and thence follows the line of the coast in a general easterly, southerly and south-easterly direction for a distance of 2 miles approximately to a point situated in plot 301, sheet XXXIII, plan 13, as shown on the map kept at the office of the Commissioner, Famagusta, and extends inland to a depth of 50 yards from high water mark throughout its length.
