No. 280. **THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1940.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1960

MADE UNDER SECTION 59.

W. D. BATTERSHILL,
Governor.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 59 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1940, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Export of Goods Prohibition Order, 1940.

2. The export from the Colony of all goods is prohibited save under a licence granted by the Registrar of Co-operative Societies and subject to such terms and conditions as may be specified in such licence:

Provided that the goods specified in the Schedule hereto may be exported without a licence to destinations within the British Empire, Palestine and Egypt:

Provided further that nothing in this Order contained shall apply to any *bona fide* baggage (as defined in item 9 of the Second Schedule to the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1940) being the property of and accompanied by a passenger and proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller of Customs and Inland Revenue to be for the personal use of such passenger.

3. The Prohibited Exports (Essential Goods) Orders, 1940, are hereby revoked.
