

No. 310. THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY LAWS, 1939 TO 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE ACTING GOVERNOR UNDER SECTIONS 3 (2) AND 7 (1).

I, the Acting Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor by sections 3 (2) and 7 (1) of the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the Law"), do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Authorization) (Italy) Order, 1945.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 3 of the Law, any person, unless I otherwise direct, may, except as provided in clause 3 hereof, trade within Italy with the Italian State or with any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business therein.

3. This Licence shall not extend to or authorize—

- (a) the performance of any contract of insurance entered into with or for the benefit of any person within the description contained in clause 2 of this Order before the date of this Order;
- (b) the payment of any bill of exchange payable in the Colony and drawn before the date of this Order to or for the benefit of any such person as aforesaid;
- (c) the encashment of any coupons by or on behalf of any such person as aforesaid.

4. For the purpose of this Order "trade" is confined to supplying any goods to or for the benefit of the Italian State or any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business therein, or to obtaining goods from the Italian State, such individuals or bodies of persons, and is deemed to include—

- (a) transactions incidental to supplying or obtaining such goods; and
- (b) the paying, transmitting or receiving of any money, negotiable instrument or security for money in respect of such trade.

5. For the purposes of this Order the expression "Italy" means the Italian mainland, Sicily and Sardinia, with the islands adjacent thereto.

6. This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 5th day of September, 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE ACTING GOVERNOR UNDER SECTIONS 2 (5) AND 9.

I, the Acting Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor by sections 2 (5) and 9 of the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the Law"), do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) (Netherlands) Order, 1945.

2. Clauses 3, 6 and 7 of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Orders, 1940 and 1941, (requiring payment of certain moneys to the Custodian and imposing restrictions and requirements in regard to certain property in the Colony) shall not apply to—

- (a) any money which would but for the existence of a state of war become payable to or for the benefit of any person within the description contained in clause 3 of this Order on or after the 10th September, 1945;
- (b) any property which on or after the 10th September, 1945, comes into the ownership of any such person as aforesaid;
- (c) any money or property to which the above-mentioned clauses would apply only because any such persons as aforesaid became resident or commenced or recommenced to carry on business in the Netherlands on or after the 10th September, 1945.

3. This Order applies—

- (a) to any individual resident in the Netherlands;
- (b) as respects any business carried on in the Netherlands to any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business;
- (c) as respects any business carried on in any territory which is neither enemy territory nor an area which is for the time being to be treated as enemy territory for the purposes of section 9 of the Law in accordance with the
