THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1945.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF KYRENIA.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Kyrenia hereby make the following bye-laws :-

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Kyrenia Municipal (Amend- Gazettes: ment) Bye-laws, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Kyrenia Municipal Bye-laws, 1939 to 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Byelaws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Kyrenia Municipal Bye-laws, 1939 to 1946.

2. Bye-law 33 of the principal Bye-laws, 1555 to 1515. deletion therefrom of the words "2p. per oke" and the substitution therefor of the words "5p. per oke".

3. Bye-law 44 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :-

"44. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the person exposing for sale any carcass of a pig or fresh pork :---

For every carcass of a pig or part thereof or portion of fresh pork-

(b) exceeding 30 okes but not exceeding 80 okes in weight ... 6s. (c) exceeding 80 okes in weight 88."

4. By-law 49 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the

deletion of paragraph (a) thereof and the substitution therefor of the following paragraph :---"(a) Goods not specifically enumerated below, other than flour

or fresh meat, fish or pork-

(i) when the value of such goods does not exceed two shillings $l\frac{1}{2}p$.

(ii) when the value of such goods exceeds two shillings but does not exceed four shillings 3p. . .

(iii) when the value of such goods exceeds four shillings but does not exceed eight shillings $4\frac{1}{2}p$.

- (iv) when the value of such goods exceeds eight shillings but does not exceed fifteen shillings.. 6p.
- (v) when the value of such goods exceeds fifteen shillings but does not exceed twenty shillings 7<u>1</u>p.
- (vi) when the value of such goods exceeds twenty shillings but 9p. does not exceed forty shillings

(vii) when the value of such goods exceeds forty shillings but does not exceed eighty shillings $13\frac{1}{2}p$.

(viii) when the value of such goods exceeds four pounds a fee of $4\frac{1}{2}p$, for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall

be added to the aforementioned fee of $13\frac{1}{2}p$."

5. Bye-law 57 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :-

"57. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner or the person in charge of the perishable goods brought into or on sale in the Market for Perishable Goods :---

- (i) when the value of such goods does not exceed two shillings 1<u>3</u>p.
- (ii) when the value of such goods exceeds two shillings but does not exceed four shillings 3p. . .
- (iii) when the value of such goods exceeds four shillings but does not exceed eight shillings 4<u>1</u>*p*.
- (iv) when the value of such goods exceeds eight shillings but does not exceed fifteen shillings 6p. . .
- (v) when the value of such goods exceeds fifteen shillings but does not exceed twenty shillings $7\frac{1}{2}p$. . .
- (vi) when the value of such goods exceeds twenty shillings but does not exceed forty shillings 9p.. . . .
- (vii) when the value of such goods exceeds forty shillings but does not exceed eighty shillings $13\frac{1}{2}p$.
- (viii) when the value of such goods exceeds four pounds a fee of $4\frac{1}{2}p$. for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned fee of $13\frac{1}{2}p$."

6. Bye-law 75 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof and the substitution therefor of the following paragraphs, respectively :----

(a) For every ox or camel of any age—	
(1) If not exceeding 30 okes in weight	<i>4s</i> .
(ii) if exceeding 30 okes but not exceeding 70 okes in	
weight	6 <i>s</i> .

"CHAPTER 11.

FEES FOR WEIGHING, MEASURING AND TESTING OF GOODS.

216. The fees to be paid under the provisions of section 184 of the Law for the weighing, measuring and testing of goods within the municipal limits shall be the fees set forth in the Third Schedule to these bye-laws.

216A. The fees to be paid under the provisions of section 189 of the Law, in respect of goods brought within the municipal limits, shall be the fees set forth in the Third Schedule to these bye-laws.

216B.—(1) Whenever any municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any of the goods enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto, such person shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the municipal corporation, upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of two paras per oke in respect thereof and such municipal weigher shall give to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such form as the Mayor may from time to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require the municipal weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt :

Provided that-

- (a) fractions under 10 paras shall not be collected;
- (b) for fractions of 10 paras and over and under 30 paras the sum of 20 paras shall be collected ;
- (c) for fractions of 30 paras and over and under 40 paras the sum of 40 paras shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be one piastre.

- (2) Nothing in this bye-law contained—
- (a) shall apply or shall be taken to apply to the weighing, measuring or testing of any goods enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto ; or
- (b) shall be taken or construed to give any municipal weigher or to the municipal corporation any right to demand the compulsory weighing, measuring or testing of any goods to which this bye-law applies."

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates : Provided that-

(a) fractions under 10 paras shall not be collected;
(b) for fractions of 10 paras and over and under 30 paras the sum of 20 paras shall be collected;

(c) for fractions of 30 paras and over and under 40 paras the sum of 40 paras shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 1p."

The above Bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.
