THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1945.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION
OF PAPHOS.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Paphos hereby make the following bye-laws :—

These bye-laws may be cited as the Paphos Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Paphos Municipal Bye-laws, 1943 to 1947 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Paphos Municipal Bye-laws, 1943 to 1948.

2. Bye-law 26 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Paphos Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 26. The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house that is to say :—

(a) For every cow, ox, bull or camel, not exceeding 30 okes in weight	6	0
(b) For every cow, ox, bull or camel, exceeding 30 okes in weight	10	0
(c) For every sheep or goat	3	0
(d) For every lamb or kid from 1st January to 30th April (both days inclusive)	2	0
(e) For every lamb or kid from 1st May to 31st December (both days inclusive)	3	0
(f) For every swine (gourounia) not exceeding 10 okes in weight	3	0
(g) For every swine weighing from 10 okes to 40 okes	8	0
(h) For every swine exceeding 40 okes in weight	10	0."

3. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 67 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

" (1) There shall be paid by the owner or the person in charge of any carcass of swine or fresh pork exposed for sale in the pork market a fee of 2s. for every carcass of swine or part thereof."

4. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 84 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Paphos Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946) is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

" (1) The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the person in charge of any animal brought to the animal market, that is to say :—

(a) For every horse or mule	4	0
(b) For every ox, cow, ass or gamoose	3	0
(c) For every camel	8	0
(d) For every pig (gourounia) not exceeding 5 okes in weight	-	6
(e) For every pig exceeding 5 okes in weight	1	3
(f) For every sheep, goat or any other animal not specifically enumerated above	1	0

Provided that whenever the owner or any person in charge of any of the animals to which this sub-paragraph (f) applies, exposes for sale in the animal market any such animals of over 10 in number, at any one time, a fee of 4½p. shall be paid in respect of every such animal, over and above the said number."

5. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 89 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

“(1) There shall be paid by every person exposing for sale in the special market any special goods a fee of not less than 3 piastres and not more than 12 shillings for every day or part of a day during which such goods are exposed for sale at such market :

Provided that for any of the following special goods, that is to say—acorns (valanidia), charcoal, cheese of any kind including halloumi, dried fruit, dried meat, flax (linari), poultry, oil, skins (dried or fresh), sausages, wine or vinegar, the fee shall be not less than 2 piastres and not more than 10 shillings.”

6. Paragraph (2) of bye-law 95 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

“(2) Before the permit is issued, the person applying for the same shall pay a fee of not less than 5s. and not more than 20s., as the Mayor may in each case determine, regard being had to the size of the booth which the applicant proposes to erect or cause to be erected.”

7. Paragraph (2) of bye-law 96 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

“(2) Every person whether the holder of a permit under bye-law 94 or not, who exposes for sale in any fair market any goods, articles or things whatsoever (other than animals) shall pay for the whole period of any fair market a fee of not less than 3 piastres and not more than 30s., as the person authorized by the Mayor in that behalf may in each case determine, regard being had to the kind and quantity of the goods, articles or things.”

8. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 243 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

“(1) The following rates shall be paid in each year in advance by the owner or lessee or occupier of any premises or building or place within the municipal limits supplied with town water, that is to say—

For every two okes of water supplied per minute for a
period of one year £2.”

9. Bye-law 248 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“248.—(1) The Council may, with the prior concurrence of the Police, from time to time—

(a) declare any street or part thereof as a street for one way traffic and indicate the one way direction of the traffic in such street ;

(b) prohibit entirely traffic in any street ;

(c) restrict traffic in any street within certain hours.

(2) Whenever a street is declared as a street for one way traffic or whenever traffic in any street is entirely prohibited or is restricted only within certain hours, the Council shall place conspicuous signals over and across such street and at reasonable height from the ground at all suitable places in such street indicating the direction, prohibition or restriction of the traffic in such street, as the case may be.

(3) No person shall take, lead, ride or drive any animal or vehicle contrary to the direction, prohibition or restriction declared or made under this bye-law in respect of such street :

Provided that nothing in this bye-law contained shall apply to :

(a) the pushing of bicycles by pedestrians or of wheel-barrows by porters in any such street ;

(b) the taking, leading, riding or driving of any animal or vehicle in any street, in respect of which such prohibition or restriction has been made, for the purpose of mounting or alighting passengers or for loading or unloading goods at or from any premises situated in any part of such street to which such prohibition or restriction applies.

(4) No person shall erect or display any sign, advertisement notice or any other matter within twenty feet of any permanent sign poster or notice regulating traffic."

10. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of bye-laws 248A, 249 and 250.

11. Bye-law 267 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Paphos Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 267. The following fees shall be paid to the town clerk and treasurer, in every year, by any person keeping any of the following places, premises or buildings, such fees to be determined by the Council :—

The fee shall be in respect of the period ending on the 31st December, of each year irrespective of the time when it becomes chargeable."

12. Bye-law 280 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 280. Whenever any municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh or measure any goods other than any of the goods specified in the Second Schedule to these bye-laws, such person shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the Municipal Corporation, upon such weighing or measuring a fee at the rate of 2 paras per oke in respect thereof :

Provided that—

- (a) fractions under 5 paras shall not be collected ;
- (b) for fractions of 5 paras and over and under 15 paras the sum of 10 paras shall be collected ;
- (c) for fractions of 15 paras and over and under 20 paras the sum of 20 paras shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing or measuring shall be 40 paras."

13. The Second Schedule to the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Paphos Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946) is hereby repealed and the following Schedule substituted therefor:—

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates :

Provided that :—

- (a) fractions under 5 paras shall not be collected ;
- (b) for fractions of 5 paras and over and under 15 paras the sum of 10 paras shall be collected ;
- (c) for fractions of 15 paras and over and under 20 paras the sum of 20 paras shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 1p."

The above Bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Governor. (M.P. 1415/12/3.)
