For the purposes of this Order the expression "Germany" means Berlin and the French, British, American and Russian Military Zones of Germany as established by the statement by the Governments of the United Kingdom, the United States of America, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Provisional Government of the French Republic on the zones of occupation in Germany on the 5th June, 1945, and also those parts of the former German Reich which are at present administered by the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

5. This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 8th April, 1948.

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY LAWS, 1939 TO 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 3 (2).

WINSTER,

Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 3 (2) of the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the Law"), I, the Governor, do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Authorization) (Germany) (No. 2) Order, 1948.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 3 of the Law, any person, unless I otherwise direct, may trade with any person to whom this Order applies in respect of any application for the registration of a patent under the Patents Laws, 1924 and 1932 or for registration of a trade mark under the Trade Marks Registration Law, 1910, made on or after the 8th April, 1948, by any person to whom this Order applies or in respect of any patent or trade mark registered on any such application, or design registered in the United Kingdom under the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1946, which is protected in Cyprus under the United Kingdom Designs (Protection) Law, 1936.

3. This Order shall apply—

- (a) to any government, public or other authority in Germany,
- (b) to any individual resident in Germany,
- (c) as respects any business carried on in Germany, to any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business.
