

- (c) every person coming to Cyprus in any vessel or aircraft which commenced its voyage or touched at any place in Egypt, Palestine, Syria, or the Lebanon, including a person in transit through Egypt, Palestine, Syria, or the Lebanon, shall be in possession of a valid certificate of inoculation against cholera on international form and any person not in possession of any such certificate may be placed under quarantine or surveillance during a period of five days.

No. 49. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1948.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 70.

WINSTER,
Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 70 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1948, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Customs Warehouses Regulations, 1948.

2. The rent to be paid on any goods deposited in any Customs warehouses shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto.

3. The Customs Warehouses Regulations, 1933 to 1937, are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

SCHEDULE. RENT.

(a) *On importation.*

	<i>Per day or any part thereof.</i>
1. For goods not packed in any receptacle, for every 100 okes or part thereof	3p.
2. For every package containing wine, spirits or any other liquid whatsoever—	
(a) not exceeding 2 gallons	3p.
(b) exceeding 2 gallons but not exceeding 40 gallons	4½p.
(c) exceeding 40 gallons	6p.
3. For every package containing machinery, cars, carriages, glass or earthenware measuring—	
(a) not more than 40 cubic feet ..	4½p.
(b) more than 40 cubic feet but not more than 80 cubic feet	6p.
(c) more than 80 cubic feet	1½p. for every 20
4. For every package containing any goods not otherwise enumerated above—	c. ft. or any part thereof.
(a) not exceeding 25 okes gross	3p.
(b) exceeding 25 okes gross but not exceeding 200 okes gross	4½p.
(c) exceeding 200 okes gross	6p.
	<i>Per week or any part thereof.</i>
5. For timber, tiles, bricks, coal, potatoes or acorns	6p. per square yard:

Provided that—

- (a) no rent shall be payable on any such goods for a period of five days from the day of the first landing thereof, inclusive of the day of landing and the day of clearance, but exclusive of any Sunday or Customs holiday falling within such period ;
- (b) no rent shall be payable on any stores imported for the Imperial or the Island Government ;
- (c) no rent shall be payable for any chemical manures for any period required for any Government analysis in respect thereof before clearance ;
- (d) no rent shall be payable for any silkworm eggs for any period required for any compliance in respect thereof with the Silkworm Industry Protection Rules, 1922, or any amendment thereof ;
- (e) goods re-exported or removed to another port in the Island from any Customs store, yard or place under Customs control and proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller of Customs and Excise to have been landed in error, shall be exempt from payment of rent for two calendar months from the first landing thereof ;
- (f) goods consigned to the Government Railway for transport to a point beyond Famagusta may remain, after all Customs dues have been paid and Customs formalities complied with, in the Customs premises at Famagusta free of rent for ten days from the day following the landing excluding Sundays and Customs holidays ;
- (g) goods sent in bond to Nicosia are allowed one clear day rent free for the time occupied in transport of the goods by rail ;
- (h) goods, not put in bond, which have been landed and deposited in any Customs premises at any port in Cyprus and which have been declared at the time of landing to be destined for any foreign port or for any port in Cyprus other than the port of landing, shall be exempt from payment of rent for a period not exceeding 20 days from the first landing thereof (herein called the "first period"). After the expiration of the first period such goods shall for any period not exceeding one month next following the first period (herein called the "second period") be liable to the payment of rent at the rates chargeable for goods in bond. After the expiration of the second period such goods shall for any period next following the second period be liable for the payment of the store rent in this part contained ;
- (i) where any delay has occurred in clearing goods from any Customs store and it is shown to the satisfaction of the Comptroller that such delay is due to circumstances beyond the control of the importer, the Comptroller may at his discretion, in special cases, and when not less than two days rent is due on such goods, allow a reduction of store rent up to seventy-five per cent of the rent due at the time such goods are cleared from Customs store :

Provided also that—

- (a) for the first ten days on which store rent is payable there shall be paid in respect thereof the full charges hereinbefore prescribed ;
- (b) for the ten days next following the period in (a) hereof, there shall be paid the one-half of the charges hereinbefore prescribed ;
- (c) for every period next following the period in (b) hereof, there shall be paid the one-quarter of the charges hereinbefore prescribed.

(b) *On exportation.*

For any goods deposited, pending shipment, there shall be paid as rent the one-half amount of the charges payable in respect of such goods as prescribed in part (a) herein :

Provided that no rent shall be payable on any goods deposited, pending shipment, for a period of six days inclusive of the day of deposit and the day of shipment.

(c) *On goods in bond.*

Per week or any part thereof.

1. Wine, spirits or any other liquid whatsoever :—
 - (1) For the first twelve months from the first landing thereof for any package—
 - (a) not exceeding 2 gallons 3p.
 - (b) exceeding 2 gallons but not exceeding 6 gallons 4½p.
 - (c) exceeding 6 gallons but not exceeding 30 gallons 6p.
 - (d) exceeding 30 gallons but not exceeding 60 gallons 1s. 3p.
 - (e) exceeding 60 gallons but not exceeding 100 gallons 2s.
 - (f) exceeding 100 gallons 3s.
 - (2) For any period next following the period in (1) hereof, there shall be paid the one-half of the above charges.
2. For tobacco or tumbeki (Persian tobacco) :—
 - (1) For the first twelve months from the first landing thereof for every bag or bale—
 - (a) not exceeding 50 okes ¾p.
 - (b) exceeding 50 okes 1½p.
 - (2) For any period following the period in (1) hereof, there shall be paid the one-half amount of the above charges.
3. For timber, for every 40 cubic feet 3p.
4. For every package containing any article not otherwise enumerated above :—
 - (a) not exceeding 20 okes gross 1½p.
 - (b) exceeding 20 okes gross but not exceeding 100 okes gross 3p.
 - (c) exceeding 100 okes gross but not exceeding 250 okes gross 6p.
 - (d) exceeding 250 okes gross but not exceeding 400 okes gross 1s.
 - (e) exceeding 400 okes gross 3s.
5. For goods not otherwise enumerated above not packed in any receptacle—
 - For every 100 okes or part thereof 3p.
6. For coal per 10 tons or any part thereof 6p.:

Per month or any part thereof.

Provided that if any goods in this part contained are withdrawn for home consumption, there shall be paid as rent double the amount of the charges payable in respect of such goods as specified herein.
