No. 6. THE LAND ACQUISITION LAWS, 1899 TO 1947.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 5.

Notice is hereby given that the following lands are required by the Governor for an undertaking of public utility :—

All that area of land situated at Pyla, in the district of Larnaca, comprising 9 donums or thereabouts, bounded on all sides by private property and including part of plots Nos. 155, 161, 150, 144, 132, 134, 136, 137, 129, 99, 94, 93, 88, 89, 23, 95/3, 95/2, 95/1, 95 and 21 of the Government Survey Plan No. XLI/3, more particularly defined as the area coloured red on the plan marked "Pyla Bye-Pass" and dated 5th October, 1947, deposited with the Commissioner, Larnaca.

The said area is at present occupied by a Bye-Pass road constructed by the War Department.

2. Any person claiming to have any right or interest in the said lands is required within six weeks from the date of this notice to send to me a statement of his right and interest and of the evidence thereof, and of any claim made by him in respect of such right or interest.

3. The Governor is willing to treat for the acquisition of the said lands.

4. A plan showing the lands described above is available for inspection at my office in Larnaca.
