THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND OLDER) REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 10) 1956.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 63A.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 63A of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 10) 1956, I, the Commissioner of Paphos, do hereby prohibit the sounding of sirens or any form of sound signal within the municipal area of Paphos.

I further order that an "alarm signal" and an "all-clear signal" shall be in force within the municipal area of Paphos and direct that the following steps shall be taken upon the sounding of the said signals:—

Upon the sounding of the "alarm signal"—

- (a) all vehicles shall be drawn to the side of the road and remain stationary until the sounding of the "all-clear signal";(b) all cyclists shall dismount and draw to the side of the road and
- (b) all cyclists shall dismount and draw to the side of the road and remain stationary until the sounding of the "all-clear signal"; and
- (c) all pedestrians shall stand clear of the middle of the street or pavement on which they are and shall not move about until the sounding of the "all-clear signal".

This Order shall come into effect as from the 31st day of July, 1956.
