THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER)
REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 2) 1957.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 30 (1).

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by Regulation 30 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 2) 1957, I, the Governor's Deputy, do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Immobilization of Small Vessels) Order, 1957.

2. No vessel which is anchored or moored within the harbours and territorial waters of the Colony shall be left unattended unless it is immobilized as follows :—

(a) in the case of vessels operated by power, by the removal of such part or parts of the engine as would render the engine incapable of being operated ;

(b) in the case of sailing boats, by the removal of the sails ;

(c) in the case of rowing boats, by the removal of the oars.

3. In this Order—

“ vessel ” includes every ship, boat, lighter and floatable craft of every kind used in navigation, whether operated by power or otherwise, of or below fifteen net registered tons.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL,
1939 AND 1956.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor's Deputy, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Modification of the Prison Discipline Law) Regulations, 1957.

2. During the continuance in force of these Regulations, the provisions of section 5 of the Prison Discipline Law (as contained in section 2 of the Prison Discipline (Amendment) Law, 1953) shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to any place in which persons are detained under the provisions of any Law, or of any Regulations made under the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, in force for the time being, and to persons so detained, as they apply to a prison and to prisoners, respectively.
