ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 22 (a) (i).

Authority to the Improvement Board of Episkopi to contract a loan.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 22 (a) (i) of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, I, the Administrative Secretary, do hereby order as follows :—

1. The Improvement Board of Episkopi (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lenders") a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds (£1,000) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

(a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lenders in nine equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);

(b) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Board for the improvement of the village streets.

2. For the purpose of securing the repayment of the sum under the loan, the Board shall, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, mortgage to the Lenders all the rates, fees, rents, tolls or charges now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Board.

Authority to the Improvement Board of Panayia to contract a loan.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 22 (a) (i) of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, I, the Administrative Secretary, do hereby order as follows :—

1. The Improvement Board of Panayia (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lenders") a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds (£1,000) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say :—

(a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lenders in ten equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);

(b) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Board for the erection of a Rural Health Centre.

2. For the purpose of securing the repayment of the sum under the loan, the Board shall, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, mortgage to the Lenders all the rates, fees, rents, tolls or charges now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Board.

NOTICE UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas it has been represented to His Excellency the Governor that it is desirable in the public interest to build fire stations and other buildings for the purpose of the Cyprus Fire Service at a number of places in the Island, the cost whereof is to be borne by the Government of Cyprus;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to declare the building of fire stations and other buildings for the purposes of the Cyprus Fire Service to be an undertaking of public utility and does hereby entrust the Director of Public Works with the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking.

NOTICE UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas it has been represented to His Excellency the Governor that it is desirable in the public interest to build a Rural Health Centre at Panayia:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, His Excellency the Governor does hereby declare the erection of the said Rural Health Centre to be an undertaking of public utility and does hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking under the provisions of the said Law, and does hereby entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to the Director of Public Works.
