THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 16th September, 1955, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 17th September, 1955, under Notification No. 546 (as amended by Notification No. 92 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 9th February, 1956) (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") His Excellency the Governor has authorized the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Kato Polemidhia and in Chiftlikler Quarter, Limassol (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months ;

And whereas by virtue of Notifications Nos. 219, 968 and 251 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of the 22nd March, 1956, 11th October, 1956 and 7th March, 1957 respectively, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 15th September, 1957 ;
