

(d) The funds of the Association shall not be used for contributing directly or indirectly to—

- (i) the funds of a trade union ;
  - (ii) the funds of a political party ;
  - (iii) the election expenses of a candidate for any election outside the Force ;
  - (iv) the funds of any body or organisation outside the Force ;
  - (v) benevolent or charitable expenses except with the express approval of the Governor ;
  - (vi) defray any expenses incurred by or on behalf of any member of the Force in respect of any criminal or disciplinary proceedings against him.
- (e) The funds of the Association may be used—
- (i) to pay expenses incurred in connection with Meetings of the Association ;
  - (ii) to pay expenses incurred by representatives in attending Meetings of the Association Committee which are not chargeable to public funds ;
  - (iii) for such other purposes as the Chief Constable may approve.

17. Except where, in special circumstances, an officer of police is required for duty for which no substitute is available, leave shall be given for attendance, at all such meetings duly held and every such attendance, as regards allowances and expenses, shall be deemed to be an occasion of police duty.

18. The Cyprus Police Association Rules, 1953 to 1956, are hereby revoked :

Provided that all members of the three committees elected under the provisions of the said Rules shall be deemed to have been elected under rule 6 of these Rules and shall remain in office until the next elections held under these Rules.

### THE POLICE LAW, 1958.

#### DIRECTION UNDER SECTION 25 (3).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by sub-section (3) of section 25 of the Police Law, 1958, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that the proceeds of the sale of any unclaimed property sold under the provisions of the said section shall, if no claim to such property has been established within the period mentioned in the said section and after the deduction of any expenses incurred by such sale, be disposed of as follows:—

- (a) Fifty per centum of the proceeds shall be paid into the general revenue of the Colony ;
- (b) Twenty-five per centum of the proceeds shall be paid into the Police Fines and Rewards Fund ;
- (c) Twenty-five per centum of the proceeds shall be paid to the finder of the property in question :

Provided that if such finder is a member of the Force the said twenty-five per centum of the proceeds shall also be paid into the Police Fines and Rewards Fund.
