THE CURFEWS LAWS, 1955. LAWS 17 AND 47 OF 1955.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by Section 2 of the Curfews Laws, 1955, and delegated to me under Section 2A of the said Laws by Notification No. 666, published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of 19th July, 1956, I o hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Curfews (Nicosia District) (No. 61)

Order, 1958.

2. No person within the area prescribed in the First Schedule hereto shall be out of doors between the hours prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto except under the authority of a written permit granted by the Commissioner of Nicosia or the Assistant Chief Constable in charge of the area:

Provided that this Order shall not apply to any member of the Executive Council, Her Majesty's Forces, the Cyprus Police Force, or persons holding a summons to appear before a Special Court, established under the Special Courts Laws, 1955 to 1957, when proceeding to and from such Court in accordance with such summons.

3. This Order shall come into force on the 16th day of October, 1958.

The Municipal area of Nicosia and the Improvement Board areas of Strovolos, Ayios Dhometios, Kaimakli and Pallouriotissa, the Village areas of Trakhonas, Omorphita, Engomi, Orta Keuy and Eylenja.
